**Catalog Description**

A 600-hour internship for community agency counselors in agency counseling setting under supervision of qualified professional. Employment of broad repertoire of primary and secondary prevention approaches to individual and group techniques, workshop leadership skills, consultation techniques and advocacy methods. Weekly meetings with faculty and on-site supervisors.

**Justification for each revision:**

1. The credits are from 6 to 12 and will be offered in fall and spring

We need to break up the one-semester internship into two semesters as an option for our students. The number of credits will be increased from 3 to 9 credits to 6-12 credits.

Students may take it in one semester as 12 credits (600 hours experience) or two semesters: 6 credits for fall and 6 credits for spring (each for 300 hours experience).

**Course Objectives/Goals**

Clinical mental health counseling interns are able to witness examples of school-college-community collaboration at their community agencies. They are also able to analyze the community settings and consider potential opportunities for collaboration. This semester-long experience provides an opportunity to integrate, apply, and process all previously acquired collaboration-related knowledge, skills, and attitudes. Students will work on shadowing a school and a college counselor, each for one day, and report their experiences analytically.

13. Counsel clients who represent the ethnic and demographic diversity of their community
14. Understand the effects of crises, disasters, and other trauma causing events
