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#### Message from the Interim Dean of the Graduate School

The purpose of this **Annual Report** is to spotlight graduate education at NC State by presenting statistical information that describes the state of this critical part of the university's mission. The Graduate School has provided this information as one way of advancing its primary aim of supporting and improving graduate education.

We have advanced that aim in other ways during the academic year of 2007/2008 as we expanded educational opportunities for graduate students.

One of the most important areas of this expansion was in professional development under the aegis of our new initiative, Preparing Future Leaders (PFL). PFL was conceived as a way of augmenting the disciplinary-based education of students and postdocs to make them more competitive in the global market. The **Professional**

Development Seminars offer training in several broad areas including grant writing, leadership, effective communication, and conflict resolution. The Responsible Conduct of Research program prepares beginning graduate students for their research endeavors and provides a foundation for responsible conduct of research throughout their professional lives. Preparing the Professoriate continues to provide advanced doctoral students a focused experience of workshops and mentoring to prepare them for college teaching. And the Certificate of Accomplishment in Teaching was moved from the Faculty Center for Teaching and Learning to the Graduate School. To improve our capacity to offer these services, we hired Dr. Melissa Bostrom as Director of Academic and Professional Development Programs and Dr. Barbie Honeycutt as Director of Graduate Teaching Programs.

We initiated a project to increase the number of Professional Master's (PM) programs at NC State, a project that will later serve as a model for the UNC System. To launch this effort, we worked with UNC-General Administration and representatives from the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation and the Council of Graduate Schools to sponsor a Colloquium on Professional Graduate Education. We have begun to talk with faculty interested in starting a PM program and have gained initial consent to explore employers' needs for such degrees. Dr. Lisbeth Borbye, former director of the highly successful Professional Science Master's program in Microbial Biotechnology, has been hired to direct these efforts as Assistant Dean for Professional Education.

Another expansion of educational opportunities occurred in the development of new partnerships with international universities. The Graduate School has played a major role in establishing dual-degree programs with Seoul National University, South Korea; Université Paul Cézanne, Aix-en-Provence, France; University of Surrey, England; and National Chiao Tung University, Taiwan. MOU's have been approved for Zhejiang University (3+1 program), Surrey University in England (International Programs); Université Paul Cézanne, Aix-en-Provence (Global Innovation Management), National Chiao Tung University, Taiwan (Industrial Systems Engineering); and Seoul National University (Genomics).


Other examples of supporting graduate education:


- The Graduate School led an effort to enhance the quality and sustainability of interdisciplinary programs at NC State by appointing and overseeing the Interdisciplinary Program Task Force. Its proposal has been accepted by the provost.
- We initiated the Provost's Fellowship program and awarded approximately \$230,000 to fund 60 Provost's Fellows. Each doctoral program was allocated two \$4,000 Provost's Fellowships and one \$5,000 University Graduate Research Fellowship to be used as top-up grants to help in recruiting.
- The Graduate School was awarded a \$2.1 million grant from the National Institutes of Health, designed to increase diversity in doctoral education and in the Ph.D. workforce in biomedical and behavioral sciences.
- In an effort to increase fellowship opportunities for students, we reached out to graduate alumni in several ways: (1) holding "Meet the Dean" events in New York City, Seattle, Korea, China, and Austin

and a fellowship donors meeting at our 13th Annual Fellowship Dinner, (2) inviting eminent graduate alumni to participate in the Graduate School's Professional Development Series, and (3) communicating with 220 graduate alumni as a follow-up to last year's feasibility study. We also received our largest-ever individual annual fund gift from a board member.









#### Doctoral Degrees by College Academic Year 2007




#### Master's Degrees by College Academic Year 2007




### Degree Recipients by Gender Academic Years 2003-2007




### Doctoral Degree Recipients by Gender Academic Years 2003-2007




### Master's Degree Recipients by Gender Academic Years 2003-2007




#### Degree Recipients by Ethnicity and Citizenship Academic Years 2003-2007




### Doctoral Degree Recipients by Ethnicity and Citizenship Academic Years 2003-2007




#### Master's Degree Recipients by Ethnicity and Citizenship Academic Years 2003-2007




### Degree Recipients by U.S. Minorities Academic Years 2003-2007




#### Master's Degree Recipients by US Minorities Academic Years 2003-2007




### Applications, Admitted Applicants and New Enrollments Academic Years 2003-2007



### Applications by Degree Academic Years 2003-2007




#### Percentage of Applicants Admitted Academic Years 2003-2007




### New Enrollments as a Percentage of Admitted Applicants Academic Years 2003-2007




### Applications by Gender Academic Years 2003-2007




### Admitted Applicants by Gender Academic Years 2003-2007









### Admitted Applicants by Citizenship Academic Years 2003-2007




### New Enrollments by Citizenship Academic Years 2003-2007




### Applications by U.S. Minorities Academic Years 2003-2007








#### New Enrollments by U.S. Minorities Academic Years 2003-2007












### Percentage of Undergraduate and Graduate Enrollment Fall 2003-2007










#### Enrollment for Full-Time and Part-Time Students Fall 2003-2007







#### Percentage of Enrollment by College Fall 2007







#### Enrollment by Ethnicity and Citizenship Fall 2003-2007


