Fun Facts about Phi Kappa Phi

- Founded in 1897 at the University of Maine, Phi Kappa Phi is the nation's oldest, largest, and most selective all-discipline honor society.
- The Society's mission is "to recognize and promote academic excellence in all fields of higher education and to engage the community of scholars in service to others."
- The motto of Phi Kappa Phi is *Philosophía Krateítō Phōtôn*, translated "let the love of learning rule humanity."
- Those elected to membership include upper 7.5 percent lastterm juniors (having completed at least seventy-two semester hours) and upper 10 percent seniors, along with outstanding graduate students, faculty, professional staff, and alumni.
- Since its founding, more than 1 million scholars have been inducted into Phi Kappa Phi.
- Approximately 3,000 faculty and staff volunteers give of their time to serve as officers of local Phi Kappa Phi chapters.
- More than 300 chapters of Phi Kappa Phi exist on the campuses of colleges and universities across the United States, Puerto Rico, and the Philippines.
- The Society's official symbols include the Phi Kappa Phi key, ribbon, and seal.
- More than \$700,000 in national and local scholarships is awarded annually.

In Memory of George Barthalmus



Dr. George Barthalmus taught over 16,000 students in zoology and biology at NCSU and won three University Outstanding Teaching Awards, the NCSU Distinguished Alumni Undergraduate Professor Award, and the Outstanding Academic Adviser Award in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. He retired in 2001, but later returned to campus to serve as interim director of the University Honors Program.

At the time of his death in 2011, he was director of the Office of Undergraduate Research. Barthalmus wrote murder-mystery novels set on college campuses and used the proceeds to support the George T. and Marina T. Barthalmus Life Sciences Scholarship Endowment. He served as president of the NCSU Chapter of the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi in 2000/2001, and throughout his career he was a passionate advocate for students.
