
Purpose

- Founded in 1897 at the University of Maine, Phi Kappa Phi is the nation's oldest, largest, and most selective all-discipline honor society.
- The Society's mission is "to recognize and promote academic excellence in all fields of higher education and to engage the community of scholars in service to others."
- The motto of Phi Kappa Phi is *Philosophía Krateítō Phōtôn*, translated "let the love of learning rule humanity."
- Those elected to membership include upper 7.5 percent lastterm juniors (having completed at least seventy-two semester hours) and upper 10 percent seniors, along with outstanding graduate students, faculty, professional staff, and alumni.
- Since its founding, more than 1 million scholars have been inducted into Phi Kappa Phi.
- Approximately 3,000 faculty and staff volunteers give of their time to serve as officers of local Phi Kappa Phi chapters.
- More than 300 chapters of Phi Kappa Phi exist on the campuses of colleges and universities across the United States, Puerto Rico, and the Philippines.
- The Society's official symbols include the Phi Kappa Phi key, ribbon, and seal.
- One million dollars is awarded each biennium in national and local scholarships.

Literacy Bonanza

Students from the North Carolina State University chapter of Phi Kappa Phi will team with the non-profit organization El Centro Hispano to teach program participants how to utilize tablets for educational purposes. The tablets will be used to enhance reading and writing literacy, health literacy, and digital literacy—"a Literacy Bonanza." In the Adult Education program, for example, students will be given a vocabulary assignment that will require participants to conduct online searches and write an essay using Microsoft Word. To encourage health literacy, participants will use the tablets and Microsoft Excel to monitor diets as part of the diabetes prevention and management class.

Faculty Recognition

Anita R. Brown-Graham joined the Institute for Emerging Issues (IEI) as director in January 2007. Before joining IEI, she served as a Professor of Law and Government at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill's School of Government. In 2004, then-N.C. Governor Mike Easley appointed Brown-Graham to the board of the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Center. She also serves as a Trustee of the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation and is active on boards and committees of several not-for-profit organizations.

Anita worked at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill's Institute of Government for 13 years, training communities in strategic planning to revitalize their distressed rural communities. Her work inspired both rural and urban communities to work together for a better future. Anita is a William C. Friday Fellow, American Marshall Fellow, and Eisenhower Fellow. She has provided significant training and written books and articles focused on developing the economic base of distressed communities.

Anita earned an undergraduate degree from Louisiana State University and, after attending graduate school at LSU, she earned a law degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
