III. New Business

a. SACSCOC requirements regarding off-campus instructional sites (Fashaad Crawford, Tim Petty, Helen Chen) Fashaad Crawford presented about off campus instructional sites. We are currently undergoing preparations for our upcoming SACS reaffirmation next year. As part of the reaffirmation there will be an onsite review team to visit NCSU and in addition to reviewing our campus they will also visit off campus instructional sites. In March 2024 the team will visit a sample of sites that house 50% or more of a program. We will provide a self-study for each of the sites that the team will use for their evaluation when they visit. If 25 – 50 percent of a program is taught at an off campus site then we have to notify SACS. If 50% or more of a program is offered at an off campus site then we need to get that location approved by SACS. Also, if we are closing an approved off campus site we have to notify SACS.

Tim Petty presented about making changes to off campus sites can result in substantive changes because we also have to report those to SACS. We will be reviewing off campus site changes through the CIM process to ensure that the changes are approved prior to implementation. This will include actions such as establishing a new instructional site, changing the address or name, relocating a site, closing a site, changing method to online delivery, changing the percentage of a program offered at a site, and re-opening a site that was once closed.

Helen Chen presented about the self-study that would include ensuring that our off campus instructional sites provide the same quality as our on campus offerings. These reviews should happen every 3 – 5 years. The office of Instructional Programs will assist with the self-study process. They will provide annotated forms for programs to use. She also provided

clarification of different terminology for program types such as dual program, joint program and articulation agreement. Dual degree will give the student two degrees, two diplomas and both institutions have their own requirements. Joint degree is when you get one degree, one diploma, and both institutions have their name on the diploma. Articulation agreement can be when there are two levels of degrees. An example of this is a Bachelor's degree earned at one institution and then articulates into a Master's degree at another institution.

IV. Information Items

a. Report from Faculty Senate (presented by Dr. Tamah Morant). The Faculty Senate is still recruiting for faculty senators for the upcoming terms and also for the faculty grievance committee. Ballots should be released in the next 7 - 10 days.
