III. New Business

- a. Student termination discussion. Students are finding out abruptly that they are losing support at the end of the semester from their advisor. This leads to students having to quickly find other types of support or shift to being self-supporting for the next semester. The committee discussed creating a process that the advisor, student, and DGP would sign off on that would outline what needs to be accomplished to document realistic academic progress. This would be a more formal approach so that students are not left at the last minute trying to figure out how to find other types of support or be self-supporting for the next semester, especially for international students where other funding sources, such as Financial Aid, may not be applicable.
- b. Meeting with the program's GSA president, they would like to draft a letter about the timeline for student fees to be paid by students at the beginning of

- the semester and if there is a way to delay or defer them to be due later in the semester. They are asking what the process is for the department level GSA to bring the request forward. The students should send the letter to the GSA executives to discuss at their meeting. (Steve Shannon)
- c. Potential changes in GSSP funding in regards to our own master's students that are currently at a disadvantage if they move into a doctoral program. There are on-going discussions about the GSSP eligibility as well as this issue. (Richard Gould)

- a. Report from Graduate Student Association (GSA) (presented by Peter Harries for Echo Pan) Evaluations of the Fall 2022 GSA travel award applications have been completed and the winners will be announced on Nov. 15. Eco is the student rep for the search for the new dean of the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences. Adam Schmidt is currently the GSA VP for external affairs and is talking to the library about childcare for graduate students. GSA is trying to work with DASA to negotiate a lower rate for students that access the health center, counselor center, and wellness and recreation center.
